P-TECH Reopening Plan aligns with that of NPS in prioritizing:

- the health and wellbeing of students and staff
- student learning and growth, and social and emotional needs
- equity and access
- teacher and staff supports



Health & Safety Protocols

Creating and maintaining safe learning environments

- 50% reduced density and no visitors
- Buses not running at full capacity and loading changes
- Daily health screening and required mask that completely covers nose and mouth; includes mask breaks
- Physical/Social distancing - maintaining a minimum of 6 feet
- Controlling the flow of traffic throughout the building
- Increased passing time
- Transition via intercom announcement
- Regular deep cleaning of high touch points, bathrooms cleaned 2x daily
- Allowing time for frequent handwashing
- No sharing of materials or use of lockers
- HEPA air filters in every classroom
- Isolation room, contact tracing, quarantining if/when necessary



Building Entry/Exit and Screening Protocol



- **Student/parent** completes **screener** prior to arriving to school
- **Arrival team** assists students upon arrival
- **P-TECH-specific entrances**
- **Staggered entry**
8:15 am - 8:30 am
- **Staggered dismissal**
2:45 pm - 3:00 pm



Dining and Food Service

Food Delivery and Options

- Grab & Go breakfast & lunch
- Served in small cohorts (no more than 25 students in a space - maintaining distance)
- **No cafeteria dining**

Cashless and Touchless

- Students scan foodservice ID
- Money added to online accounts

Health/Safety Protocols

- Masks worn at all times
- Signage and assigned locations
- Meals labelled for allergens



September 1 - 4: Special Schedule



Access to **breakfast and lunch** grab/go - onsite and at locations nearest to schools



4-day **special schedule** to support students in transitioning back to school



Daily 50-minute **advisory**; weekly throughout the school year




Review new safety protocols, procedures as well as “**traffic patterns** and **directional flow**”

Technology and Laptop Deployment



- Online app used for screener; paper copy available
- Use of online tools to engage remote learners; emphasis on synchronous learning
- 1:1 laptop program; Chromebook/laptop exchange August 18 - 21
- Online support, depot service for in-person tech support, and internet access
